Facilitation of Learning Processes: examples

- 1) OCHA Rolac, **Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs for the United Nations System**, requested Juan's services in the design, development and facilitation of their "Humanitarian Programme Cycle" learning materials and Training of Trainer's Programme.
- 2) For the The International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies we facilitated various senior managers retreats, designed learning programmes for their country representatives, and recently facilitated a Lessons Learned Exercise with Red Cross/Crescent partners in Nepal..
- 3) **The Global Food Security Cluster** (WFP & FAO) engaged our services in the design, development and delivery of a five day learning process for Cluster Coordinators. We conducted a Learning Needs Analysis, re-designed the existing materials and have successfully facilitated six training sessions over a period of three years with a total of approx 150 participants.
- 4) **Plan International** engaged our services in the learning needs analysis, design and delivery of a simulation based training programme on "Leadership and Management in Emergencies" as well as "Operations Support in Emergencies" and "Disaster Preparedness in Emergencies". We facilitated such trainings over a period of three years in the Asia, Americas, and West Africa Regional Offices, as well as in the Country Office in Nepal and the International Headquarters in UK.
- 5) The Secretariat of the World Humanitarian Summit engaged our services to design the consultation process and facilitate a series of consultative meetings in Latin America, including the regional consultation with 180 participants from 30 countries whereby the Latin America and Caribbean region debated their contribution to the 2016 World Humanitarian Summit in Istanbul.
- 6) ICRC and IFRC commissioned Juan to design and facilitate a learning exercise entitled "Civil Military Relations" hosted in Kuala, Lumpur, Malaysia. He designed the event, interviewed a plethora of key informants, facilitated the learning event and produced a report and roadmap.
